

# **Basics of Adult Literacy Education:**

This site is primarily designed to provide a broad overview of issues in Adult Literacy for instructors with limited formal training or experience in teaching adult literacy learners. Some in-depth coverage of topics is also provided for more experienced instructors. **The course is online, self-paced, and free.** Visit the site, print out the course worksheets and click through the screens for the content. Two contact hours of professional development can be awarded by the local program upon the completion and submission of a copy of each module's *Ideas, Notes, and Reflections Worksheet*.

**The course is divided into five sections:**

**1. The Adult Learner (2 hours)**

- underlying theories and practices of adult learning
- process of how adults learn

**2. Orientation and Assessment (2 hours)**

- purposes behind orientation and assessment
- possible influences on adult learners of these practices
- ideas for carrying out these tasks

**3. Curriculum Development (2 hours)**

- common purposes adults have for improving their literacy skills and the types of information that will help them
- what skills to include in the plan for instruction to meet your learners' needs
- resources for literacy content already developed by others

**4. Instructional Techniques (2 hours)**

- common instructional techniques used in adult learning
- the variety of methods instructors can use to convey content to adult learners
- ideas for implementing these methods

**5. Adult Literacy Classroom (2 hours)**

- the structure and logistics of adult literacy instruction and supporting adult learners
- the ways in which an adult education class can be organized to support adult learners
- ideas and resources for creating schedules to fit you and your learners

- Self-assessments to customize your learning
- Research and information on a variety of Adult Literacy Education topics
- Quotes, real-life examples, and tips from adult education practitioners
- Links and resources for further study

In addition to free courses, World Education also has **paid courses available**. They are online and either scheduled or self-paced. The cost ranges from \$189 to \$269.
