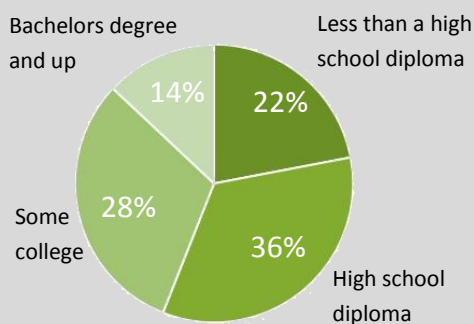

The Adult Education Program, operated by South Georgia Technical College, provides free classes to students seeking to earn their GED, score higher on the Accuplacer and/or enhance their literacy abilities.

This program earned the Certified Literate Community status in 2011. This designation was earned by the instructors and the board who showed that the community could work together to promote, support, and enhance local literacy efforts. Schley County CLCP is working hard to make a bright future for our community's families and workforce.

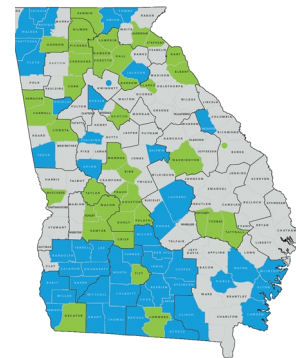
